Res Hall Rendezvous was an event that allowed students to showcase their rooms to prospective residents. It was designed for all undergraduate students that had not graduated and would be returning to campus for the Fall of 2021. It would allow them to see the rooms they would potentially be living in the next year. This particular event had to be COVID friendly so instead of normal tours, there were virtual sessions. RHA was able to bring the tours to the students through video submissions of the different rooms and suites available. The event targeted new audiences, including incoming first-years (1,700 students) that have never visited campus before. The videos are also publicly available on CWRU's RHA website to any interested students, staff, or families.

RHA provided tours for students by students. They tried capture what the residential experience could look like in different residence halls. The goals of Res Hall Rendezvous include giving students a look at their housing options while also giving all current residents a chance to win awesome prizes through the passive video contest.

Alongside the video contest, there was a Zoom meeting held with breakout rooms for each of the halls where students gave live tours. Additionally, there was a breakout room that gave students the opportunity to talk to ResLife and University Housing staff.

Ultimately, this event was designed to educate students on CWRU residential options while exploring the residential community first hand, and it was a huge success creating resources for RHA, Housing, and ResLife to use for years to come.

Typically, Res Hall Rendezvous (RHR) is a traditional two-day program hosted every spring before the Office of University Housing opens the lottery for the fall. This was the 9th annual RHR.

> Every year, RHA works with the Offices of University Housing and Residence Life to provide one lucky attendee first choice in housing before the standard lottery process opens. Additionally, members of Housing and Residence Life are present to answer any questions about the selection process on both days.

RHA uses campus shuttles to transport first-year students to the South Residential Village which is home to all second-year residence halls. Then we have building tours given of various halls by residents and RHA Executive Board members. The next day, second-year residents are shuttled to the North Residential Village to tour various upper-class housing options.

<>ADAPTING THE PROGRAM<>

First thought: Find old videos that had been made in the past to share with residents.

Programming with intentionality: How can we meet the needs of students that lived both on and off campus without actually being able to tour the Residence Halls? Those did not exist.

Utilizing Zoom as a way for a large group gathering & also breakout rooms for a more personalized tour experience.

Have residents create and provide access to video resources that could be used for years. Make the video aspect a competition to encourage participation and creativity.

FALL 2020 - COVID rules change programming

NOV. 16th, 2020 - RHR is introduced to programming committee.

FEB. 1st, 2021 - First GB of the semester, Programming Committee meets and discusses RHR. Brainstormed video contest idea.

FEB. 8th, 2021 - Program design finalized - video contest & Zoom Town Hall with live tours. Program date set for Feb. 28th.

FEB. 15th, 2021 - RHA Cribs presented to GB.

FEB. 17th, 2021 - RHA Cribs submission opens & RHR marketing begins.

FEB. 19th, 2021 - Rescheduled to March 7th to accommodate Housing selection schedule. **FEB. 22nd, 2021** - RHA President reached out to the Undergraduate Student Government (USG) for help marketing to all undergraduate students, regardless of residency status.

FEB. 22nd, 2021 - Council competition started and sent to council presidents.

FEB. 22nd, 2021 - Marketing shared the new date (March 7th) and emailed all residents. **FEB. 28th, 2021** - Early video submission due date. Extended to be March 15th at 11:59pm. **MAR. 1st, 2021** - USG email sent out. Secured Housing/ResLife officials for Town Hall. **MAR. 1st, 6th, 2021** - Final secial media and marketing pushes

<u>MAR. 1st-6th, 2021</u> - Final social media and marketing pushes. <u>MAR. 7th, 2021</u> - RHR Town Hall Sessions held! First choice housing winners determined.

MAR. 15th, 2021 - RHA Cribs submission closes officially.

MAR. 16th-23rd, 2021- Videos reviewed for policy violations. Raffle/video winners determined and prizes distributed. Gift cards distributed to all volunteers.

MAR. 24th, 2021 - RHA Cribs videos released on rha.case.edu. Linked on case.edu/housing.

<u>APR. 9th, 2021</u> - Housing lottery begins for rising second-year and upper-class students. <u>MAY 20th, 2021</u> - RHA Cribs videos emailed to all incoming first-year students <u>JUN. 3rd, 2021</u> - Housing selection opens for first-year students.

The videos recorded for the passive portion of the program created a new resource for the Housing office. Now there is footage of the housing options for all years (including first years) so they can reference the recordings in the future. This provides a reference for years to come so that incoming students know what their future home will look like.

Housing and Undergraduate Admissions have both emailed the videos out to students.

At the end of any successful event, it is important to take a look back and look at the positives, negatives, and identify ways you can improve going forward.

Positives:

- Created a new video resource for Housing
- Gave live tours before housing selection opens
- Introduced many new residents to what RHA does
- Connected students with Housing and ResLife officials
- Successfully adapted a traditional program to a virtual format

Negatives:

Hard to track attendance on Campus Groups
Did not have video submissions from every residence hall
Hard to accommodate volunteers who needed to leave
Didn't always get to tour common areas

Suggestions Going Forward:

Have tour guides play the video tours and talk over or pause
Incorporate common areas into video tours

- Create multiple shifts for volunteers

- Specifically target residence halls without video submissions by reaching out to members of RHA, NRHH, or even RA's who live in those buildings.

I am pleased to lend my support to Case Western Reserve University Residence Hall Association's CAACURH Program of the Year bid for their program, Res Hall Rendezvous. Res Hall Rendezvous has been a longstanding event over the past eight years, designed to assist students with the room selection process by touring residence halls, engaging with students who live in these halls, and meeting with university staff to ask questions about the process. Due to the pandemic and the university's covid restrictions, RHA had to reimagine how to turn a successful in-person event into a virtual event that would be educational, beneficial, and easily accessible to students.

I was very impressed by the group's ingenuity and creativity. After going through many different ideas, they decided to do not only "live" tours via zoom but also held an RHA Cribs contest for students to submit a video tour of their room. They also kept some of the features of the original program as part of the new virtual event. Housing and Residence Life Staff were accessible in a breakout room via zoom to answer questions and review information on the room selection website as well as discuss the residence life program for either second -year residence or upper-class residential communities. Incentives were included, continuing the long-standing raffle of "first selection in the room lottery process" as well as raffles for additional prizes.

RHA made it a point to engage the current residents in the process and in the end had more students volunteering for live video tours of their room and submitting videos for the RHA Cribs contest. Due to the success of the RHA Cribs videos, University Housing included links to these videos our website for incoming students to view. RHA recognized that the incoming class of 2025 did not have an opportunity to visit campus or see a residence hall room in person. This was a positive by-product of an event originally designed for returning students.

I fully support CWRU Residence Hall Association's Program of the Year Bid. These amazing and dedicated student leaders did not let covid restrictions deter their ability to adapt a meaningful program into a reimagined event inclusive to all students. Hey CAACURH,

We write to you today in support of Case Western Reserve University's Program of the Year bid for Res Hall Rendezvous 2020. This program is a staple of our spring lineup, and we are so excited to share all the hard work we put into it with you all.

When the pandemic hit, we knew programming was going to be more difficult than ever before, but how do we make sure that our traditions carry on? How do we provide a resource to students that always has assisted with housing selection in the spring?

When the final idea was first introduced, we thought it was never going to work nor be as successful as years past. Little did we know that this event would have over 40 video tours of campus housing options submitted, roughly 260 attendees the day of, and nearly 30 volunteers providing live tours of their residence halls over Zoom.

Not only was the event itself successful, but we never could have realized the impact the RHA Cribs video contest would have on the campus community. These videos are linked in emails from University Housing to all residents of CWRU before our housing selection opens, and they are sent out to all incoming first-year students before their selection opens in the summer. The Class of 2025 would not have had the opportunity to go into residence halls prior to moving in as all campus tours cut out the Residence Life portion in order to protect current students. By having these videos available to the public, we gave them that chance.

The 2020-2021 RHA Executive Board had to be innovative. In doing so, they created a program that adapted a tradition to a virtual format, promoted safety during a pandemic, educated residents on on-campus housing options, and established a resource that RHA can build upon for years to come. The 2021-2022 Board already has so many ideas on how to add to the video contest and work with offices on campus such as University Housing, First-Year Experience and Family Programs, and Undergraduate Admissions to further educate both existing residents and new first-years as they start their journey at CWRU.

We highly support CWRU's bid for Res Hall Rendezvous as Program of the Year and appreciate your consideration of our work.
